



Revegetation – Seed Program

Revegetation doesn't have to be complicated. With the right support, your school can confidently run a 6–12 month revegetation program that engages students and strengthens your local environment. Our Seed Program is the ideal entry-level choice for schools with a keen gardener or teacher who knows their native plants and loves getting them to grow.

Age level

Prep–Grade 6

Number of students per session

Optional as sessions are teacher-led.



What's involved

Planting site survey by an expert botanist

This is a quick survey of the project site prior to commencing, to gain an understanding of the site and develop a restoration plan. It helps us see which native plants are already present, understand the site characteristics and develop a species list of suitable plants to be planted and restore the site. It also allows us to identify weeds that may need to be managed in preparation for planting.

Duration: 1 hour (ecologist only). **Location:** planting site and surrounds. **Timing:** 4–6 months before planting day.

What's involved



Seed/cutting collection with students

Our expert botanists will create a tailored list of local native plants for your site and give you access to our online plant database, The Plant Hub, complete with practical tips on identification and propagation. You'll also receive a ready-to-use lesson plan to help you run your own seed or cutting collection session with students. Schools will need to supply their own materials such as gardening gloves and secateurs, and to obtain a seed collection permit (we can help with this).

Duration: optional (teacher-led). **Location:** local park and/or school grounds. **Timing:** 2 months before planting day.

Planting day

This is a fun, hands-on outdoor session where your students plant native seedlings to help create new habitat for local wildlife. Your school leads the activity, with students taking ownership of the planting and learning throughout the session. We provide step-by-step planting instructions through our online Plant Hub, along with practical tips to help your seedlings thrive. We can also help you order native seedlings from a specialist plant nursery if you need them.

Duration: optional (teacher-led). **Location:** local park or school grounds. **Timing:** April-August.

Monitoring your plants

Students return to their planting site to see how their seedlings are growing and observe how the new habitat is beginning to change. We provide a step-by-step lesson plan to help you run your own monitoring session, along with practical information and resources so students can continue tracking plant growth and habitat changes over time.

Duration: optional (teacher-led). **Location:** planting site. **Timing:** three months after planting day and then every twelve months.

Cultural heritage session

A fun, interactive session led by a Traditional Owner that gives an introduction to cultural knowledge through dance, art, storytelling and games.

Duration: 1.5 hours (includes two 45 minute sessions). **Location:** incursion. We can run the sessions either indoors (e.g. library or large, open space) or outdoors (e.g. oval, basketball court). **Timing:** all year round, including NAIDOC Week and Reconciliation Week.

Maintenance

We provide information and tips on our online Plant Hub to help you identify common weeds and safely remove them from your planting site, making it easy to look after your site into the future.

Duration: optional (teacher-led). **Location:** planting site.

Timing: three months after planting day.
